GENERAL RULES

The Adjudicator's decision is final and NO communication is allowed between parent/teacher and Adjudicator <u>at any time</u>. The Festival Section Chairs need all information submitted regarding school schedules and closures (e.g. field trips, special events, etc.) and entry changes by January 17, 2025 for accurate programming before printing. Special requests (e.g. wheelchairs, music stands, props, etc.) must be noted in the empty box on the registration on MFS or by email to the chair of the section.

- 1. Unless otherwise stated, this Festival is open to <u>amateur</u> individuals or groups residing in the COWICHAN VALLEY REGIONAL DISTRICT and the GULF ISLANDS.
- ** An amateur shall be defined as a music, drama, or dance **Student** whose principal means of livelihood is not obtained from the practice of music, drama, or dance, or from solo performances in the particular category in which he/she is competing.

"All competitions shall be open to non-professional who are living or studying in BC and who are selected by adjudicators at the festival level. This condition does not apply to those bona fide students of the performing arts who teach for the purpose of applying the money, so earned, for the furtherance of their education and does not preclude occasional remuneration received for service rendered in the arts."

- 1. All competitions shall be open to non-professional performers, including:
 - a. full-time students of the performing arts who teach, if they apply the money so earned to further their education.
 - b. those who receive occasional payment for services rendered in the arts, where it is not their primary source of income.
 - c. conductors of non-professional choirs.

ANY TEACHER OR PROFESSIONAL PERFORMER MAY ENTER ANY OPEN CLASS FOR <u>ADJUDICATION ONLY.</u>

- 2. After the entries are received, the Committee will decide the order in which the classes will be taken and the order of competition.
- 3. The Committee may subdivide a class into two or more sections.
- 4. The Committee may alter, modify, or cancel any of the classes detailed in the syllabus or program.
- 5. The Committee reserves the right to alter the time of any competition.
- Performers in the Gala or Highlights Concerts are <u>chosen by the adjudicators</u>. All competitors <u>MUST</u> be prepared to appear at a Gala or Highlights Concert if requested by the Festival Committee. Each performer may receive one complimentary ticket if needed (for the performer only).
- 7. Complaints or protests must be received by the Corresponding Secretary, in writing together with a \$25 fee, <u>at least two weeks prior</u> to the Annual General Meeting.
- 8. Any discussion or other communication with the Adjudicator by parents, students or teachers is NOT allowed and will result in DISQUALIFICATION.
- 9. NO PRACTICING ALLOWED ON CONCERT INSTRUMENT OR THE STAGE.

PERFORMANCE RULES

- 1. Special equipment needed for a performance must be noted on the Registration i.e. In the theatre we can provide chairs, piano, music stands and change rooms. In other venues we can provide piano and chairs <u>only</u>.
- 2. Performers are requested to assemble at least 15 minutes before their class begins.
- 3. No performance shall begin until the adjudicator signals.
- 4. Competitors may change the performance order of selections listed. <u>Please inform Section Chairman</u> <u>prior to class.</u>
- 5. Conflicts in the order of performance must be communicated to the Section Chairman one week prior to the start of the Festival, with the exception of Dance (see Dance Entry Rule #6).
- 6. An individual competitor or group may not perform the same selection in more than one class.
- 7. Where feasible a recess will be arranged during the session.
- 8. No performer may practice on the performance stage or piano.
- 9. For further information concerning performance, telephone the Section Chairman. (see page 1 of Syllabus).
- 10. Concert etiquette is expected. NO videos, audio recordings or photographs may be taken during competitions, adjudications, workshops, etc. Cell phones must be turned off within the performance venue. PERFORMING ARTS BC (COWICHAN MUSIC FESTIVAL) reserves the right to take official photographs at appropriate times for archival and publicity purposes.
- 11. SEE RULES FOR SPECIFIC SECTION(S) ENTERED.

ENTRY RULES

The Adjudicator's decision is final and NO communication is allowed between parent/teacher and Adjudicator <u>at any time</u>. The Festival Section Chairs need all information submitted regarding school schedules and closures (e.g. field trips, special events, etc.) and entry changes by January 12, 2025 for accurate programming. Special requests (e.g. wheelchairs, music stands, props, etc.) must be noted on the registration or by email to the Chair of the Section

As of the November 1, 2024, Registration will be open in an online format provided by Music Festival Suite (MFS) Starting on October 1, 2024 you will be able to access MFS through our website: cowichanmusicfestival.com, OR DIRECTLY AT: <u>https://cmfest.musicfestivalsuite.com</u>

1. Profiles will need to be created for every participant, their parent and teacher. Before a participant can create a profile, they will need their parent's and teacher's ID #. Accompanists need a profile as well. You can start now to create profiles on October 1, 2024, so that you are ready for registration starting November 1, 2024. Be sure to write down the entrant # and password. Each profile should have their own email and password. Payment for on-line registration is via Stripe, but you do not need a Stripe account. You can use a credit card.

NOTE: MFS requires that each participant has a photo waiver signed by their parent. Starting October 1, 2024, you (the parent) should sign into MFS, and the request will come up for you to okay the photo waiver. Imperative that you do this, as teachers and studios cannot register your child until this is done.

- 2. ENTRIES CLOSE DEC. 17, 2024. Absolutely no registrations will be accepted late.
- 3. No entries will be accepted by telephone.

- 4. The **MFS** system does not provide us any way to make changes once the registration has been made. Therefore, there will be no TBA's. You must have the name of your piece when you register.
- 5. In all classes where an age limit is set, entrants must be of the specified age as of December 31, 2024. Birth Certificate may be requested.
- 6. Entrants must provide the Adjudicator with an ORIGINAL copy of "Own Choice" music or literary work with the **measures marked at the beginning of each line**. This must be handed to the Adjudicator's Secretary, prior to performance.

**THE USE OF PHOTOCOPIED MATERIAL BY PERFORMERS OR ACCOMPANISTS IS PROHIBITED. IF ORIGINAL SCORES ARE NOT AVAILABLE A LETTER IS REQUIRED FROM <u>THE PUBLISHER</u>. The use of music downloaded from the internet is permissible as long as it is accompanied by receipts for the number of copies downloaded. In the event that membership in a site provides free use of the material downloaded, proof of membership must be provided. COMPETITORS ATTEMPTING TO USE UNAUTHORIZED COPIES OF COPYRIGHTED MATERIAL WILL BE DISQUALIFIED.

- 7. Where a test piece is specified in the Syllabus, a copy thereof will be supplied to the Adjudicator by the Committee.
- 8. Please indicate on Registration if entering a Competitive Class FOR ADJUDICATION ONLY.
- 9. No performer may perform more than once in any class, either solo or duo/trio. This may result in disqualification.
- 10. **OPEN CLASSES** have no age limit but entrants are advised that these classes are for the more advanced performers and will be judged accordingly.
- 11. See Rules for specific section (s) entered. Entrants in doubt about the correctness of their entry forms may email the Section Chairman BEFORE January 12, 2025. Dance see Dance Entry Rule #6

THE BRITISH COLUMBIA MUSIC FESTIVAL COMPETITION

2025 PROVINCIAL FESTIVAL will be held in Victoria, June 1 - 5, 2025

BEFORE ENTERING: PLEASE READ GENERAL RULES, ENTRY RULES, AND PERFORMANCE RULES, on pages 2 and 3, and ENTRY FEES listed in this section.

All entries must be submitted through the studio in which the dancer trains. All incomplete entries will be returned to the appropriate studio. If the dancer is a resident of the Cowichan Valley who trains elsewhere, he or she may enter as an independent dancer. Entries which are not completed by the deadline for rough copy changes will not be included in the program.

- 1. Registration must indicate whether they the dancer (solos only) wish to be in the <u>COMPETITIVE or PERFORMANCE</u> category.
- 2. The name of the dance, the title and composer of the music and the choreographer MUST BE SPECIFIED ON EACH REGISTRATION. ENTRIES WITHOUT THIS INFORMATION will be not be included in the program. The name of the show is to be included if it is a musical theatre piece. (use the Opus line on the reg. form) The name of a private dance studio must not be part of the dance name. Any substitution of original material will result in the entry receiving an ADJUDICATION ONLY. NOTE: Check specific rules for each Division. Entries in an incorrect class will be DISQUALIFIED.
- 3. **GROUPS** must include 4 performers or more. Class age is determined by adding all ages together and dividing by the number in the group. The age of any individual should not be more than 2 years over the class age. **PRODUCTION NUMBERS** must include 8 performers or more, and must have a **Theme** or **Storyline**.
- 4. No performer may perform more than once in solo, duo, or trio classes in each division. This will result in DISQUALIFICATION.
- 5. Entrants in all classes are eligible to perform at one of the Gala or Highlights Concerts and <u>MUST BE</u> prepared to perform, **if chosen by the Adjudicator**.
- 6. Entrants in doubt about the correctness of their entry forms should contact their Dance Teacher, who will contact the Dance Committee for clarification. Changes made after the deadline will result in Adjudication Only
- 7. A rough copy of the program will be available to all schools and studios as soon as possible after January 6, 2024. Changes on rough copy must be made prior to January 17, 2025. No changes WHATSOEVER after this date.

8. In order to be eligible for Provincial Competition, dancers must enter a minimum of two solos in a discipline and must attend the master class in their age group. All entries must be complete by the <u>entry deadline</u>. PERFORMERS MUST RECEIVE 2 MARKS OF 85 OR OVER. "Drop Ins" for master classes are not eligible.

PERFORMANCE RULES

- 1. Any discussion or other communication with the Adjudicator by parents, students or teachers is not allowed and will result in disqualification.
- 2. All music must be in to the Dance Chair by February 14/25. Preferred method is USB stick. Please, group music by Day/Date. with each music piece labeled with class # and dancer's position # and whether the dance starts on or off. Example: 02-18-25 Class 12345 #3 On
- 3. Lyrics, costumes and dance content must be suitable for the age level of the dancers and reflect Festival standards. If, in the opinion of the Adjudicator, language, content or costuming is inappropriate, he or she will ring the bell, the music will stop and the dance will not be completed. No adjudication will be given and the performers will not be permitted on stage for adjudication.
- 4. Props must be integral to the performance and MUST BE SET AND STRUCK BY THE DANCER. Props must not be just for scenery.
- 5. There is **no glitter** allowed in the theatre, whether in costumes, hair, makeup or props. Studios who fail to comply will be billed for theatre cleaning.
- 6. Studio identification is not to be worn onstage by anyone at any time, including adjudication.
- 7. **OBSERVE TIME LIMITS -** All dances will be timed. Overtime dances will be disqualified.
- 8. Teachers must be in open classes only. If a teacher is needed to substitute for a missing dancer, that entry will be moved to an open class.
- 9. No food or drinks are allowed backstage.
- 10. **<u>NO PARENTS</u>** are allowed backstage without prior permission from the Dance Committee. No teachers are allowed backstage during any music interpretation class. However, they may sit in the audience, Row "F" or higher.

PERFORMANCE RULES (cont'd)

- 11. The program will proceed as scheduled. It is the responsibility of the performers to free their time accordingly. Notify the Committee of the intention to withdraw from a class BEFORE the session begins.
- 12. All music must comply with copyright rules, with no changes to music or lyrics whatsoever. If lyrics are unacceptable, find and submit the "clean version".
- **13.** Lights are pre-set and will remain the same for all performances. The curtain will not be used.
- 14. DO NOT ENTER OR EXIT THE THEATRE DURING A PERFORMANCE OR ADJUDICATION.
- 15. Only one <u>actively</u> supervising adult per entry is permitted in the dressing room area per session.
- 16. No phones backstage. See Dance Chair for exceptions.
- 17. Large classes (over 13) will be broken down into two (2) classes. Example: 12345a or 12345b.

DANCE

AWARDS

A number of AWARDS will be given to encourage and assist worthy entrants in their pursuit of artistic studies. To merit these awards, competitors must reach a standard of accomplishment satisfactory to the Adjudicators. The AdjudicATORS HAVE SOLE RESPONSIBILITY FOR THE SELECTION OF RECIPIENTS.

CATEGORY DEFINITIONS:

ACROBATIC DANCE: - All participants must be supervised during routine. Routine must be 50% DANCE and 50% acrobatic elements. No flames, sharp pointed objects or mats. Acro tricks are defined as any rotation when the performer's hips pass over their shoulders. Examples are tucks, walkovers, chin and elbowstands, handsprings, handstands, roundoff and aerials. Movement where one foot is in contact with the ground (ie illusion) is permitted. All participants should have an emergency plan in event of injury. A simple prop may be used as an integral part of the routine.

Groups: a lift/supporting dancer must maintain direct contact with the stage at all times.

No more than 3 ACRO movements described above, excluding cartwheels will be allowed in other Dance Disciplines such as Tap, Stage, S & D, Jazz, Lyrical Jazz and Contemporary. At the Adjudicator's discretion, Dancer(s) using too many of these movements in these Dance Disciplines will receive an adjudication only

BALLET: Dance based on any method of classical ballet technique. (Russian, Cecchetti, R.A.D. etc.) The dance tells no story. No sets permitted; hand-held prop may be used if integral to the dance. **NO VOCAL MUSIC IN SOLO CLASSES. Dances with Lyrics must be in Lyrical Ballet Category.**

<u>CHARACTER</u>: A definite character must be portrayed whereby the dancer becomes the whole character using any medium other than the pure classical form: e.g. mime, and telling a story. Music and dance should not be taken from the Musical Theatre. Simple props may be used if integral to the dance. <u>NO VOCAL MUSIC</u>.

DEMI-CHARACTER: As interpreted through the Ballet medium using ballet steps from the waist down, and the character from the waist up with minimal use of simple props, if integral to the dance. **NO VOCAL MUSIC**.

INTERPRETIVE: Any technique may be used as long as the body is the medium of interpretation to portray an intangible idea or mood, real or imaginary, modern, abstract or traditional; NO<u>VOCAL MUSIC</u>. Keep in mind that the dancer should not portray a person or character.

CONTEMPORARY BALLET: Incorporates classical ballet techniques with greater range of movements which may not adhere to strict body lines for classical ballet. This style includes non-traditional movements, such as more relaxed steps, floor work and turned in legs, etc., to portray the concept of being more innovative, free and earth-bound. They physical interpretation of the theme that the choreographer envisioned allows for more expressive emotions and feelings.

LYRICAL BALLET:

Continual, gentle flowing technical ballet movements. Music may contain words. No lip-syncing permitted. THIS ENTRY DOES NOT QUALIFY FOR PROVINCIAL RECOMMENDATION

CATEGORY DEFINITIONS: (cont'd)

<u>NATIONAL</u>: An **authentic** National dance from any <u>specified</u> Country. Music and costume should correspond to the dance. Highland dances are permitted.

FOLK: Group dances, Own Choice. Country/Folk dance: i.e. France/Farondole, Austria/Schulplattler, Scotland/Dashing White Sergeant. Any authentic singing game or folkdance, excluding Maypole Dance.

CHARACTER-NATIONAL: Dance based on traditional dance style of one country. **Must portray a character in dance form.** Highland dances are permitted.

<u>CONTEMPORARY</u>: Free movement of dance encompassing various dance disciplines; a constantly evolving style of movement that explores and gives physicality to human ideologies, behaviours and emotions, with emphasis on engaging the whole body. <u>VOCAL OR NON-VOCAL MUSIC.</u>

MODERN: A stylized dance form with its foundations on a technique based discipline such as Graham, Limon, Cunningham, Humphrey, Horton and Ailey, etc. Dance based on the dynamism of natural rhythms such as contraction and release, fall and recovery. **VOCAL OR NON-VOCAL MUSIC.**

TAP: Dance based on any recognized tap technique. Straight tap, hand-held props: i.e. hat, cane. Must not have tap dancing sounds in music. **VOCAL OR NON-VOCAL MUSIC**

JAZZ: Traditional: Dance based on any recognized jazz technique. An interpretation of the music in the jazz dance idiom. Free movement, improvised and usually characterized by syncopated rhythm and use of isolated movements. No more than two acrobatic tricks are permitted in this category. Splits and jazz floor work permitted. **Does not include Hip-hop/Street dance steps** - see Division Eight.

LYRICAL JAZZ: A Lyrical Jazz routine places emphasis on flowing lyrical movements while using Jazz technique. May interpret the lyrics or mood (intent) of a song. **VOCAL OR NON-VOCAL MUSIC**

STREET DANCE: A constantly evolving form of dance that relies on individualism and personal style and emphasizes the expressive power of movement – should include but not be limited to choreography that incorporates a blend of contemporary, funk and street style with jazz technique. May include gliding, popping, locking, waving and utilize house, old school and new school. May also include gymnastics/power moves or any series of tricks or stunts as long as music, costumes and lyrics are age appropriate.

MUSICAL THEATRE:

Song and Dance: - Routine suited to a stage production. 50% own voice, 50% dance. <u>NO VOCAL MUSIC</u>. **Modern Stage/Variety**: - dance suited to a stage production, musical theatre, review, or cabaret, etc. Must be entertaining and diversified in movement and have a character base. No live voice. Lip-synching permitted, but not encouraged.

PROVINCIAL EXCELLENCE

Provincial Excellence class participants will attend the BC Provincial Festival on the final day only. Classes, which will be held on the last day of provincial festival competition, will require the performance of an improvised Solo of 1.5 minutes (90 seconds) duration to be performed to music selected by the adjudicator and will be considered part of the adjudicators' assessment when selecting the winner of each genre. Participants will additionally perform three (3) solos, one of which will be chosen by the adjudicator from current existing repertoire in the respective genre. The remaining two (2) solos should be selected from the categories listed for that specific genre and should demonstrate a well-rounded program of artistic styles and versatility. Adjudicators will select the repertoire solos and information as to which solos are to be performed in any given year, and this information will be posted on the PABC website well before registration opens. Detailed information as to which solo/variation, which ballet, musical etc. the solos are taken from and which specific company version is to be used will be included as well as information as to accessing the solos and music, Repertoire chosen will be readily accessible online. No exceptions to this rule will be permitted.

PROVINCIAL EXCELLENCE CLASSES

- 1. Provincial Excellence classes have replaced the Provincial-National classes and include all disciplines. See individual disciplines for Provincial Festival performance requirements.
- 2. Competitors in these classes will continue to be chosen by Adjudicators at local festivals and will be expected to be performing at a very high level, generally higher that that required for recommendation to Senior. In Dance, competitors are expected to be at the standard of apprentice level of a professional company.

Ballet - Males: Dark tights and a solid-coloured shirt or solid-coloured leotard, ballet slippers. Hair neatly groomed.

Masterclass Pre-registration in the online platform is required to be eligible for Provincial consideration.

The Adjudicator's decisions are final and no communication is allowed between the adjudicator and parent or teacher at any time.

The general rules apply to this section as well as the piano-specific rules below.

Each entry must be for one class, and must include:

Piano-specific rules

- 1. Entrants may enter a maximum of four classes, not including sight reading.
- 2. Classes for Preliminary level 3 will be adjudication only.
- 3. Students will be given a verbal and written adjudication at the end of each programmed class. This may include a placing at the adjudicator's discretion for levels 4 ARCT.
- 4. Major awards may be given to piano students levels 4 ARCT, who enter at least 2 classes.

- 9. An original copy of sheet music must be provided to the adjudicator, with measure numbers marked at the beginning of each system.
- 10. Entrants in all classes are eligible to be chosen by the adjudicator to perform in the Gala and/or Highlights concerts, and must be prepared to do so.
- 11. Performance order will be according to the program which will be available several weeks prior to the Piano section performances. Approximate times will be given and attempts made to meet needs of students.
- 12. Students should introduce their piece including name and composer.

MUSICAL THEATRE Section, Divisions One to Four, follows the Vocal/Choral Section.

RULES

- 1. Before submitting entries to this section, please read General Rules, Entry Rules and Performance Rules and VOCAL/CHORAL ENTRY FEES listed in this section.
- In all classes other than Vocal Choirs the title, composer, and musical work (where applicable) <u>MUST BE_ON</u> <u>THE REGISTRATION</u>. ENTRIES WITHOUT THIS INFORMATION must be completed BEFORE January 12, 2025. After this date, any substitution or lack of specific information will result in the entry receiving Adjudication Only. **NOTE:** Check specific rules for each Division.
- 3. Entrants <u>must</u> provide <u>TWO ORIGINAL COPIES</u> of music, one for the adjudicator and one for the accompanist, with the <u>measures marked at the beginning of each line</u>. The music must be the same in both copies. Transposition (written) is permitted with the accompaniment also transposed in full from the original. If a transposition is being used, there must be a copy provided to the adjudicator. THE USE OF PHOTOCOPIED MUSIC BY PERFORMERS OR ACCOMPANISTS IS PROHIBITED. IF ORIGINAL SCORES ARE NOT AVAILABLE, <u>A LETTER IS REQUIRED FROM THE PUBLISHER OR SOURCE OF COPY</u>. The use of music downloaded from the internet is permissible as long as it is accompanied by receipts for the number of copies downloaded. In the event that membership in a site provides free use of the material downloaded, proof of membership must be provided. Competitors attempting to use unauthorized copies of copyrighted material will be disqualified.
- 4. Copies of selections in all classes are to be marked with competitor's name and class number. Music must be picked up after the <u>class</u> is completed.
- 5. Selections may not be repeated two years in a row. Selections **must** be memorized, otherwise for adjudication only.
- 6. Operatic arias are NOT permitted in any Junior or Intermediate classes nor in Division One: Vocal Solos at the Senior level.
- 7. Contemporary Pop Music is *not* acceptable with the exception of Division Ten Ensembles only & Classes 2019 & 2019A Mixed Media.
- 8. No recorded or electronic accompaniment is permitted. Exception: See School Groups Class 2019.
- 9. In Vocal Classes, competitors are allowed one solo entry only in each Division. To be eligible for Provincial competition and major awards, performers <u>must</u> enter Division One: Vocal Solos and at least two other classes of classical repertoire; Senior performers must enter an Oratorio or Opera selection (see Division Three and Division Five)
- 10. Each competitor is requested to announce his or her selection(s) at the time of performance.

PERFORMING ARTS B.C. REQUIREMENTS - RE: 2024 PROVINCIAL COMPETITIONS

- 1. Participants will be selected from their festival in the same manner as in previous years.
- Provincial Voice winners will be determined by their classical voice performance only. NOTE: <u>Provincial Standard</u>: Junior, age 14 and under, recommended minimum level Gr. 4; Intermediate, age 17 & under, recommended minimum level Gr. 7; Senior, age 22 & under, recommended minimum level Gr. 9.
- 3. One selection must have been performed at the local level. This applies to Junior, Intermediate and Senior Levels.
- 4. Art Songs must be sung in original language, **NOT** a translation.
- Opera: Senior and National Classes. Must be sung in original language. Recitative must be included where applicable.
 NOTE: NO OPERATIC ARIAS ARE PERMITTED AT THE JUNIOR AND INTERMEDIATE LEVELS.
- SACRED ORATORIO/CANTATA/MASS: Language is optional. Recitative must be included where applicable.
 NOTE: NO SELECTIONS FROM MAJOR SACRED WORKS ARE PERMITTED AT THE JUNIOR LEVEL with the exception of those included in the Graded Songbooks published by the Royal Conservatory, Conservatory Canada, and other major institutions.
- 7. Contemporary Pop is excluded at all levels.
- 8. The use of Canadian compositions is strongly encouraged. Contact the Canadian Music Centre at 604-734-4622. The Association provides a prize for the best performance of a Canadian work in all voice classes.
- 9. Use current Royal Conservatory, Conservatory Canada, or other major institution's Syllabus as reference for noted grade levels.
- 10. MEMORIZATION IS MANDATORY IN <u>ALL</u> VOICE CLASSES.

CHORAL CLASSES OFFICIAL 2025 SYLLABUS

Adjudicators at the local festival may choose, in each of the Choral categories, up to two choirs that are felt to be of an exceedingly high standard. The signed recommendation along with the recording of the performance and original music shall be sent to the Provincial Office.

Provincial Festival

Mp3 files forwarded by the local Festivals will be adjudicated prior to the Provincial Festival, with winners announced during the Festival. There will be a \$500 grand prize and other cash awards for winners of each class. Note: Choirs submitting recordings to the Provincial level of competition must perform the same selections on which they

- were recommended by the adjudicator at the local level. 1. Participation is limited to amateur choirs, performing in the appropriate class(es) at affiliated festivals.
- 2. A choir may enter only one choral class at the Provincial level.
- 3. A festival official must supervise and witness the recording of the performance of choirs recommended for Provincial competition.

MUSICAL THEATRE

The Adjudicator's decision is final and NO communication is allowed between parent/teacher and Adjudicator <u>at any time</u>. The Festival Section Chairs need all information submitted regarding school schedules and closures (e.g. field trips, special events, etc.) and entry changes by January 12/25 for accurate programming before printing. Special requests (e.g. wheelchairs, music stands, props, etc.) must be noted.

RULES: Refer to Vocal/Choral Rules

To be eligible for the adjudicator's recommendation to the Provincial Competition and for major awards, performers <u>must</u> enter <u>all three SOLO</u> Musical Theatre classes, one song from each Division. Those choosing to enter only two classes, must select one song from Division 1.

ALL ENTRIES MUST INCLUDE <u>ORIGINAL</u> COPYRIGHT DATE. On the registration form, please put the copyright date after the show name, i.e. South Pacific (1958).

Musical Theatre is focused on a play or movie based on a simple plot developed by dialogue and interspersed with songs and dances. Selections <u>MUST</u> be age appropriate, of the performer's own sex and demonstrate a breadth of style and <u>MUST</u> be from a stage or motion picture musical. **Contemporary pop, reviews, and encore pieces are not acceptable.** Selections must be chosen from full stage or motion picture musical productions only. Memorization is mandatory. In Junior classes, selections from animated musical productions (Little Mermaid, Shrek, etc.) are acceptable.

SELECTION OF MATERIAL AND LANGUAGE CONTAINED THEREIN MUST BE APPROPRIATE FOR FESTIVAL PRESENTATION, IE. NO SWEARING OR BAD LANGUAGE

**NOTE: The performer is responsible for verbally setting the scene of the piece. This must include a brief introduction of the song, who is singing it and a description of how the song relates to the entire musical.

N.B. In a solo performance, the accompanist is not permitted to speak or sing.

Costuming and staging are expected and will be adjudicated. Hand-held props, that are integral to the performance, are allowed along with ONE simple stage prop (e.g. chair or stool) providing that the competitor can set it up without assistance and in a minimum of time). This must be an integral part of the performance. The use of live flame such as candles is strictly forbidden.

Note: <u>Solos</u> - Medleys are not permitted - Time Limit: Jr. 5 minutes, Int. 6 minutes, Sr. 8 minutes <u>Groups</u> - Medleys permitted - Time Limit 10 minutes (Set-up and introduction time not included in

timing)

NB: Sharing copies of music is once again permitted. The name of each performer must be clearly identified on the page of the song with measures marked at the beginning of each line.

FAMILY GROUP: Entry Fee - \$30.00
